Progress update on a voluntary code for political lobbyists


During July and August 2023, we held meetings with government relations consultants on the concept of a voluntary code of conduct for "third-party" lobbyists.

Attendees at the meetings agreed that the Ministry would prepare a first draft of an ethics-based code setting out expectations for all lobbyists. Summaries of these meetings can be found on the Ministry's <u>Political lobbying webpage</u>.

The Ministry has now completed a first draft of the code, and government relations consultants registered with the project are currently considering it before providing feedback. We will then circulate the refined draft code to our wider stakeholder groups for further review, inviting feedback.
