Welcome to our sixth newsletter about the Ministry of Justice's political lobbying project.

Progress update on a voluntary code for political lobbyists

We are making good progress in exploring what a voluntary code of conduct for lobbyists might look like.

In December 2023, the Ministry shared an initial draft code with government relations consultants to invite their review and feedback. We also hosted a meeting on 25 January with government relations consultants to discuss their feedback on the draft code.

As foreshadowed in our previous newsletter, we have now refined the draft code, which outlines good practice expectations for lobbyists.

Recapping our work so far on developing the voluntary code...

In April 2023, the Ministry was asked to support "third-party" lobbyists to develop a voluntary code of conduct as part of the Government's work to support greater transparency around lobbying at Parliament.

Since then, we held a series of meetings with government relations consultants to explore the concept of a voluntary code. Most attendees agreed that a lobbying code should apply to anyone influencing government decisions, and suggested the Ministry draft an ethics-based code as a first step. As well, the Ministry ran an online survey on the approach to a code of conduct, and we shared interim results with you in December 2023.
