DECISION

- [1] The substantive decision upholding the complaint is Ye v Chen [2015] NZIACDT 68 (www.justice.govt.nz).
- [2] In that decision the Tribunal reviews the grounds for the complaint, it suffices to note that the Tribunal found the issues were at the low end, there were mitigating factors, and the circumstances potentially made this a case where the Tribunal should take no further action after upholding the complaint.
- [3] None of the parties contended the Tribunal should take any further action. For the reasons set out in the substantive decision I am satisfied the nature of the complaint and the mitigating circumstances do require that the Tribunal take no further action. Accordingly, the Tribunal's order is that it will take no further action pursuant to section 50(b) of the Act.
