## IN THE MATTER OF

A complaint by <u>THE POLICE</u> against <u>COREY GRANT MCINTOSH</u> under s 74 of the Private Security Personnel and Private Investigators Act 2010

## DECISION

- [1] The Police initially laid a complaint in July 2022 against Corey Grant McIntosh on the following grounds:
  - [a] That he has disqualifying convictions pursuant to s62(f)(vii) of the Act as in 2020 he was convicted of assault and threatens to kill; and
  - [b] He was facing two charges of assault with a blunt instrument.
- [2] On the basis of the complaint, Mr McIntosh's Certificate of Approval (COA) in the classes of crowd controller, document destruction agent, personal guard, repossession agent and property guard that was valid until 29 August 2023 was suspended on 1 November 2022.
- [3] The Police have now advised that Mr McIntosh has been arrested on 26 new charges. He is currently remanded on electronically monitored bail, and they have provided a bail address for him.
- [4] On the basis of this address, on 11 May Mr McIntosh was directed to respond to the complaint and advise whether he wishes to defend the complaint or not by 24 May 2023. He was advised that if he did not comply with the Authority's directions, his COA would likely be cancelled.
- [5] Mr McIntosh has not responded to the Authority's directions. Therefore, on the basis of the complaint and Mr McIntosh's lack of engagement with the Authority, his COA is cancelled effective immediately as I cannot be assured that he is suitable to be a security worker any longer. Mr McIntosh must return his identification badge to the Authority immediately.
- [6] A copy of this decision is to be provided to Mr McIntosh, the Police and published on the Authority website.
