

IN THE MATTER OF

A complaint filed against **TOMINIKO LOLESIO** under The Private Security Personnel and Private Investigators Act 2010 (the Act)

DECISION

[1] In April 2024 Immigration New Zealand advised that Tominiko Lolesio was illegally in the country and was not entitled to work as a security guard. We wrote to Mr Lolesio asking him to provide a copy of his work visa or other evidence that he was still suitable to be a certificate holder. We also advised Mr Lolesio that if he did not file a response his certificate of approval was likely to be cancelled or suspended.

[2] Mr Lolesio has neither provided evidence that he is entitled to work in New Zealand nor any other response to the complaint made against him. Based on the evidence before me I am satisfied that Mr Lolesio is not suitable to be a certificate holder until he acquires the appropriate visa or immigration status to allow him to work in New Zealand.

[3] I make the following orders:

- a) Tominiko Lolesio's certificate of approval is suspended effective from the date of this order.
- b) Tominiko Lolesio may apply for the suspension order to be lifted any time up until 10 March 2025 when his certificate expires by filing a copy of his work visa or other evidence that he is legally entitled to work in New Zealand.
