What is this form for?

Use this Notice of Appeal form if you want to appeal to the Immigration and Protection Tribunal (the Tribunal) against a Refugee and Protection Officer's decision to:

- Decline your claim for refugee or protected person status;
- Decline to accept for consideration your claim for recognition as a refugee or • protected person;
- Cancel or cease your recognition as a refugee or protected person; or
- Refuse to consider your subsequent claim for refugee or protected person • status.

Important information

- Please read Guide 2 A Guide to Lodging a Refugee and Protection Status Appeal before you start completing this form. The Guide will help you assess whether you are entitled to an appeal and provides information on how to lodge an appeal.
- If your appeal is against a decline of your claim for refugee or protected person status, and you are:
 - > liable for deportation or may in the future be liable for deportation, and
 - > entitled to an appeal on humanitarian grounds,

you must lodge that appeal at the same time as this appeal. To lodge a humanitarian appeal you must complete Form 5 (the form for Humanitarian Appeal Against Deportation) available at www.justice.govt.nz/tribunals/immigration/immigration-andprotection or by contacting the Tribunal. You will be required to pay a lodgement fee of NZ \$700 with Form 5.



2 How much does it cost to lodge an appeal?

• Lodging this appeal with the Tribunal is free.

How do you complete this form?

- You must complete this form in English.
- Please print in CAPITAL LETTERS if filling out by hand.
- · You/your representative must complete all the parts of this form. If you have a representative, he/she should sign it as well.
- · If you are providing any documents or evidence in support of your appeal, ensure that the documents are certified copies and in English or with a certified translation in English. Two copies of all documents need to be provided.
- · If you are a minor appellant (under 18 years of age and not married or in a civil union), a responsible adult must sign on your behalf. If you do not have a parent present to act as responsible adult, tick the relevant box in Part 5 of this form and the Tribunal will nominate a responsible adult to act for you.

- 4 How long do you have to lodge this form?
 - If you are in prison or detention you have 5 working days after the date you were notified of the decision by the Refugee Status Branch to which this appeal relates to lodge this form.
 - If you are not in prison or detention you have 10 working days after the date you were notified of the decision by the Refugee Status Branch to which the appeal relates to lodge this form.



5 How do you lodge this appeal?

- You must lodge this Notice of Appeal in person, by courier or by post to the Tribunal at the address at the end of this form.
- You may also send in advance a copy of this Notice of Appeal by fax but note that you will still need to deliver or post the original of this Notice of Appeal and any supporting documents to the Tribunal.

6 What will happen after you lodge your appeal?

- After you have lodged your appeal, the Tribunal will write to let you know that your appeal has been received.
- A copy of your appeal will be sent to the Refugee Status Branch who will provide relevant information from your immigration file to the Tribunal.
- If you change your representative or your (or your representative's) contact details change you must notify the Tribunal immediately.



7 Who can help you with this form?

- The following persons can help you complete this form:
 - > a lawyer
 - > a licensed immigration adviser
 - > a licence-exempt person.
- Note: Only the above persons can act as your representative. The Tribunal can only accept appeals lodged by you or any one of the persons listed above. For more details, please refer to *Guide 2*.

Definitions

Appellant	An appellant is the person who appeals a decision.
Certified copy	A true copy, approved by someone legally allowed to approve it. If you are in New Zealand, certified copies must be approved by a lawyer, notary public, Justice of the Peace or court official.
Certified translation	A written translation from one language into English that has been officially certified by a recognised translation agency. A translation by a friend or family member will not be accepted.
Decision	The letter from the Refugee Status Branch telling you that your refugee and/or protection status has been cancelled.
