When to use this form

Use this Notice of Appeal form if you are a resident or permanent resident and would like to appeal to the Immigration and Protection Tribunal (the Tribunal) against your liability for deportation.

If your spouse/partner and/or any adult children (aged 18 and over) are also liable for deportation, each of them must complete a separate appeal form and pay a separate fee.

If your dependent children are also liable for deportation, they must each complete a separate appeal form, but they are not required to pay a separate fee, provided their liability for deportation arises from the same circumstances as yours.

What you need with your application

To complete your application, you need to send:

- A fully completed form AND
- The fee for filing this Notice of Appeal (\$700)

You should also send if you can:

- · A copy of your Deportation Liability Notice or Notice of Re-activation
- Copies of any other documents or evidence you wish to submit in support of your appeal
- Evidence of your spouse/partner's children's immigration status in New Zealand (if applicable)
- Copies of your children's birth certificate, adoption certificate, and/or death certificate (if applicable)

All documents must be in English or with a certified translation in English. The original and one copy of all documents need to be provided.

Completing this form

- · Complete this form in English.
- You can fill in this form electronically. If you do this, you must also print, sign, submit it to the Tribunal.
- You can also print and fill in this form by hand. If filling out by hand, please print carefully.
- If you are a minor appellant (under 18 years of age and not married or in a civil union), a responsible adult must sign on your behalf. If you do not have a parent present to act as responsible adult, tick the relevant box in step 8 of this form and the Tribunal will nominate a responsible adult for you.

Please read *Guide 3 – A guide to making a deportation appeal by a resident/permanent resident* before you start completing this form. The guide will help you assess whether you are entitled to an appeal and will provide the information on how to lodge an appeal.

Application process

You must lodge this Notice of Appeal form together with your lodgement fee and all relevant documents by email, in person, by courier or by post to the Tribunal at the address at the end of this form. The Tribunal must receive it within the time limit.

If you send a copy of this Notice of Appeal with your proof of payment by email, the Tribunal will accept it on that date but you still need to deliver or post the original of this Notice of Appeal and supporting documents to the Tribunal.

After you have lodged your appeal, the Tribunal will write to let you know that your appeal has been received.

A copy of your appeal will be sent to Immigration New Zealand who will provide any information and/or relevant parts of your immigration file to the Tribunal.

If you change your representative, or your (or your representative's) contact details change, you must notify the Tribunal immediately.

Important Information

It is an offence under the Immigration Act 2009 to make any statement, provide information, evidence or submissions knowing that they are false or misleading in any material aspect in any appeal or matter in the nature of an appeal to the Tribunal.

Terms used in this form

The following contains a list of terms that are used in this application form. The definitions are provided as a guide only and should not be taken as legal advice.

Appellant	An appellant is the person who appeals a decision.
Certified Copy	A true copy, approved by someone legally allowed to approve it. If you are in New Zealand, certified copies must be approved by a lawyer, notary public, Justice of the Peace or court official.
Certified Translation	A written translation from one language into English that has been officially certified by a translation agency. A translation by a friend or family member will not be normally accepted.
Decision	The letter from Immigration New Zealand or the Minister of Immigration telling you what they decided in regards to your application.
Dependent child	A dependent child means a child under 18 years of age who is not married or in a civil union and who is dependent on you (the principal appellant), whether or not the child is your child.
Minor Appellant	A minor appellant is an appellant who is under 18 years of age and not married or in a civil union.
Representative	A representative must be a lawyer, a licensed immigration adviser, or a licence-exempt person. For the full list, see <i>Guide 3 – A guide to making a deportation appeal by a resident/permanent</i> .
Responsible Adult	This is either the minor appellant's parent or a person nominated by the Tribunal.

Do a quick check

Before sending in the form – check: You have answered all the relevant steps in English If you can, you should also provide: A copy of your Deportation Liability Notice and a copy of the relevant pages of your passport showing your visa (whichever is applicable). Any relevant information you want the Tribunal to take into account when considering your appeal (in English or with a certified translation). The original and one copy of all documents should be provided. Evidence of your spouse/partner's and children's immigration status in New Zealand (if applicable). Your children's birth certificate, adoption certificate, and/or death certificate (if applicable). Each person liable for deportation, including dependent children, must complete a separate appeal form. (Children do not need to pay a filing fee.) You and your representative (if you have one) have signed this form.
