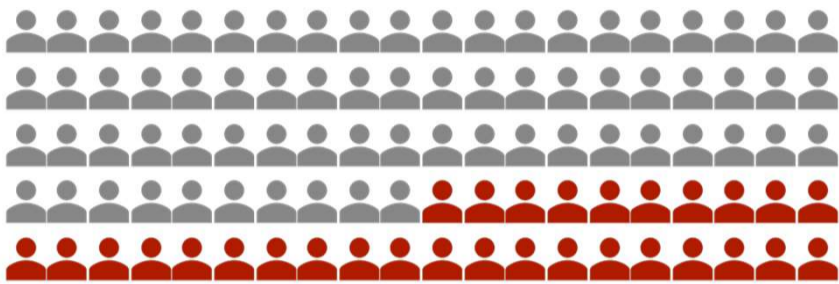

...of 100 adults

70 adults did not experience any crime over the last 12 months



7 adults in the village experienced **interpersonal violence**



5 adults in the village experienced **theft and damage offence**



6 adults in the village experienced **fraud and deception**



2 adults in the village experienced **cybercrime**

...of 100 households

80 households did not experience any household crime over the last 12 months



12 households in the village experienced **burglary**

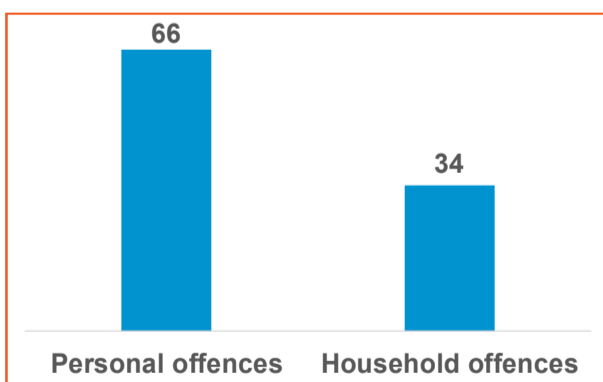


6 households in the village experienced a **vehicle offence**



2 households in the village experienced **trespass**

For every 100 offences in the village...



25 were reported to the Police

Motor vehicle thefts is the offence **most commonly reported** to the Police (**94%**)

Sexual assault is the offence **most commonly NOT reported** to the Police (**94%**)

On average

29 PERSONAL OFFENCES PER 100 ADULTS

31 HOUSEHOLD OFFENCES PER 100 HOUSEHOLDS

Who experiences crime?

Compared to the NZ average **30%**

More likely

- ➔ Adults aged **20 – 29 years (37%)** and **40 – 49 years (36%)**
- ➔ **Māori (38%)**
 - Analysis shows that Māori are younger and live in more deprived areas and these factors contribute to their higher likelihood of victimisation
- ➔ Adults who had **never married or been in a civil union (36%)**

Less likely

- ➔ Adults aged **65 years and over (20%)**
- ➔ **Chinese adults (22%)**
- ➔ Adults who were **widowed (17%)**
- ➔ Adults living in **Southland (20%)** and **Tasman (19%)**
