## Official Information Act request: Court Security Officers

Thank you for your email of 30 May 2023, requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), information regarding the employment of Court Security Officers by the Ministry of Justice (the Ministry).

For clarity, I have split your request into seven individual questions. I have provided answers to each of your questions below.

1. The total number of court security officers employed by the Ministry (FTE equivalent), and a breakdown of how many CSOs are based at each distinct courthouse or tribunals unit.

In order to provide the number of Court Security staff employed by the Ministry based on location, we have provided a headcount number rather than full-time equivalent (FTE) information<sup>1</sup>. I can advise that as of 30 May 2023, the Ministry employed a total of 328 Court Security staff. The total headcount includes permanent Court Security Officers, Senior Court Security Officers, and Court Security Managers.

It is important to note the Ministry operates a national Court Security service. In response to the changing security environment and to ensure the safety and security of everyone who visits our sites, the Ministry will deploy Court Security staff to cover courts in different locations. Table 1 reflects this information, where applicable.

2. A total figure of how many CSOs have been under the employment of the Ministry each year between 2015-2022, broken down by year.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Full-time equivalent provides an FTE value between 0 and 1 depending on the proportion of full-time hours employees in permanent and fixed term positions work. Headcount provides the number of employees working with the organisation in permanent and fixed term positions so relates to the total number of people.

The total number of Court Security Officers, Senior Court Security Officers, and Court Security Managers employed by the Ministry on 30 June each year is provided in Table 2.

3. The total number of vacancies for CSOs currently advertised by the Ministry. What is the average length of time it is taking for these roles to be filled from advertisement to the signing of an employment agreement, and is the Ministry having difficulty recruiting staff?

As at 7 June 2023 two Court Security Officer roles were advertised or in the recruitment process. For May 2023, the average length of time from advertisement to appointment of a Court Security Officer role was 13 weeks. The Ministry does not consider it difficult to recruit Court Security Officers.

4. The total percentage of staff turnover of court security officers each year, since 2015. I ask that a gender split of this staff turnover is also provided.

Table 3 below shows turnover of Court Security Officers, Senior Court Security Officers and Court Security Managers. This information has been provided to you from 2014/15 to 2022/23 and is split by gender.

5. The average length of service of a court security officer.

As at 30 May 2023, the average length of service of a Court Security Officer is 3.49 years.

6. The gender split of current court security officers, broken down by male, female or other.

I can advise that as of 30 May 2023 the Ministry employed 61 female and 260 male Court Security Officers. Gender is self-identified, those who do not wish to disclose are not included in the gender split above.

7. The salary bands for court security officers based on length of service/experience.

The Ministry does not base remuneration on length of service. Therefore, this part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act as the information does not exist. Employees are appointed to set salary bands based on their skills and prior experience. Employees can progress through the salary ranges on an annual basis, subject to their performance. Table 4 shows the salary bands and salary range for Court Security Officers, Senior Court Security Officers, and Court Security Managers.
