## Notes for Table 1:

- This data may differ from previously released or published data. This data was extracted from the case management system as at 3 August 2022.
- This data counts all individuals (excluding organisations) that have been a respondent to a single granted protection order application, filed in either the family or criminal jurisdiction
- Only granted applications are counted. Lapsed, Withdrawn, or Discontinued applications are not counted
- The year 2004 is used as the start year as this is the year that the case management system was introduced.
- 'Unknown' is recorded as the gender of a respondent when their gender is not found in the case management system.
- This data counts respondents who have had a single protection order made against them (granted applications) in the given time period. Not all protection orders will necessarily still be in force.
