Theft from a person (excluding by force)</li> </ol>	<p>Victim level data used only where victim is aged 14 years and above to align to NZCASS responding population (15 years and above is the scope for NZCASS but as questions relate to the year prior, the respondent could be 14 at time of incident).</p> <p>Victim level data is more appropriate than offence level data to align to the collection of NZCASS personal offences. Victim level data is larger than offence level as there can be multiple victims per offence.</p>
Assaults	<p>SCENE = TOTAL SCENE</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Acts intended to cause injury</li> </ol>	<p>Victim level data used only where victim is aged 14 years and above to align to NZCASS responding population. Note 15 years and above is the scope for NZCASS but as questions relate to the year prior, the respondent could be 14 years at time of incident.</p> <p>Victim level data is more appropriate than offence level data to align to the collection of NZCASS personal offences.</p>
