





### Who experiences crime?

Compared to the NZ average 30%

#### More likely

Adults aged 20 – 29 years (37%) and 40 – 49 years (36%)

#### Māori (38%)

• Analysis shows that Māori are younger and live in more deprived areas and these factors contribute to their higher likelihood of victimisation



Adults who had **never married or been in a civil union** (36%)

- Adults aged 65 years and over (20%)
- Chinese adults (22%)
- Adults who were widowed (17%)
- Adults living in **Southland (20%)** and **Tasman (19%)**
