## Crimes (Increased Penalty for Providing Explosive to Commit Crime) Amendment Bill

- 1. We have considered whether the Crimes (Increased Penalty for Providing Explosive to Commit Crime) Amendment Bill ('the Bill'), a members' Bill in the name of Alastair Scott MP, is consistent with the rights and freedoms affirmed in the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990 ('the Bill of Rights Act').
- 2. The Bill amends the Crimes Act 1961 to increase the maximum penalty for providing explosives to commit an offence, from two years' imprisonment to five years' imprisonment.
- 3. We have concluded that the Bill appears to be consistent with the rights and freedoms affirmed in the Bill of Rights Act.
