DECISION

- [1] Mutual Communication Limited has applied for a licence under the Secondhand Dealers and Pawnbrokers Act 2004 (the Act). Its managing director Allen Chen has applied for a certificate under the Act. The Police object to the issuing of the licence and certificate as Mr Chen was convicted of carrying on business as a secondhand dealer without a licence on 11 September 2015.
- [2] Section 22(b) of the Act provides that a person is disqualified from holding a certificate, and in turn a licence, if he has been convicted within the last five years of an offence under the Act which is punishable by a fine of more than \$2000.00. Mr Chen's conviction under s 6(6) of the Act therefore disqualifies him from holding a certificate unless he is granted a waiver of disqualification under s 23 of the Act.
- [3] Mr Chen has not applied for a waiver. Nor has he provided any information to show that there are special circumstances to suggest he should not be disqualified from holding a certificate.
- [4] The Police opposition to the granting of a licence to Mutual Communication Limited, and a certificate to Mr Chen, is upheld as Mr Chen is disqualified from holding a certificate under s 22(b) of the Act. The application for a licence by Mutual Communication Limited and a certificate by Mr Chen are therefore refused.
